Dear Friends:

EEN's innovative programs for young people with disabilities were recognized by many Washington area organizations through grants, awards and honors in 2005. In celebration of its 40th anniversary, *Washingtonian* magazine named KEEN Greater DC as one of the "40 organizations [that] strengthen the bodies and spirits of young Washingtonians." KEEN was also selected for inclusion in the 2005 Catalogue for Philanthropy: Greater Washington as one of the small charities "making a difference" in the DC area. Distributed to over 30,000 households in the Washington, DC, area, this catalogue offers KEEN a unique introduction to the most prominent donors in our community. Such exposure heightens KEEN's visibility, allowing us to further our mission.

KEEN was also recognized by Cure Autism Now (CAN), one of the most important advocacy groups for autism research. Recognizing the dearth of programs like ours that are accessible to children with autism, CAN designated KEEN as the recipient of 10 percent of the proceeds from registration for its annual 4th of July 5K Run. We put together a large team of athletes, their families, and our volunteers to participate in the event, impossible to miss in our bright orange shirts and even brighter smiles.

The year ended with a spectacular event that will pay dividends in 2006 and beyond. In November, the Federal Communications Bar Association Foundation named KEEN the sole beneficiary of the proceeds of their annual silent auction—over \$76,000—to bring KEEN programs into Southeast, DC. We are excited beyond words to be expanding sports and recreation activities for children with disabilities—even profound and severe disabilities—into this part of our community. There is no question that, "It's Happening!" for KEEN Greater DC.

KEEN's mission is to foster the self-esteem, confidence, skills and talents of its athletes through non-competitive activities, allowing young people facing even the most significant challenges to meet their individual goals.

About KEEN

he need for sports and recreational programs for children and young adults with more profound and severe disabilities was enormous in 1992 when KEEN was founded, and that need continues to this day. KEEN provides children with autism, cerebral palsy, Down syndrome or other disabilities an opportunity to shoot hoops, kick a soccer ball, bowl, swim or dance with the help of volunteer coaches. Because of the nature of the challenges they face, most KEEN athletes cannot participate in typical adaptive sports teams and leagues. Indeed, for many of our athletes, KEEN is the only organization that can accommodate their special needs.

Led by volunteers who donated more than 10,000 hours of their time in 2005, KEEN provides recreational services entirely *free-of-charge*. The facility rentals, equipment, and other services required to operate KEEN's programs are funded through fundraising events, grants and private donations.

What makes KEEN unique is that *every child is accepted* in the program, regardless of the nature or severity of his or her disability. In its open, unstructured and non-competitive environment, every child can enjoy every activity without the fear of losing or not being the best. Athletes gain confidence and self-esteem, and perhaps most important, a sense of social belonging. And they have fun!






